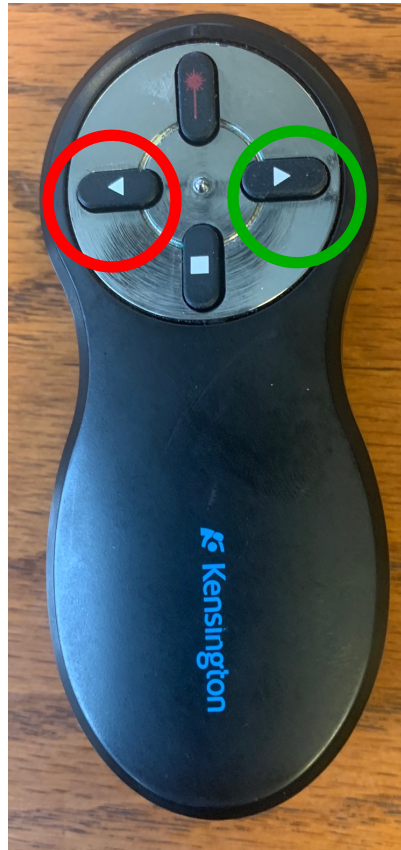
Peer Review Questions
